Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.


We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). At the Nationals, I have watched judges look at the names on the sheets long before they were recording the winners. Needless to say, I now see no need to drive or fly to a contest to be home-towned at that particular event.

Also, I hardly ever judge any more for the above reasons.

Our event at Bassett Place Mall is just a show, not a contest. There are no vendors and we do not sell anything at the Mall. If some one wants to buy something, you make arrangements to have them make contact later. Yet several of our members have freely given models to someone that wanted to present them to a friend, neighbor or spouse. Good PR and promotes modeling and the look of happiness and friendship on

the face of the person that was given the model is pretty nice.

# Palm Springs Air Museum

While on vacation I stopped by the Palm Springs Air Museum in California.

What I found most interesting were the models made by Ed and Danna Wachtendonk.

They created the Flying Dutchman Airship Co. located in Wile Rose, Wisconsin. Welder by trade Ed became an accomplished welding artist making ship models out of metal and wood. Some of his models measure from 9 to 14 feet long. What makes Ed's models interesting is that his models have cutaways to see the individual compartments of ships, cockpits, engine wells and airframes.











To give you an example of what he does, he welds 1" diameter square tubing that will form the keel and welds cold-bent hull ribs every 2" along the entire length of the ship.

I encourage people to stop and tour the museum it is an active, flying museum.

They have a flyable A4 Skyhawk for sale for 2 million dollars, if you are interested.


