David Torres brought a 1/35th scale Chinese Type 63 APC as used by the North Vietnamese. David used the Bronco kit and built it OOB. He used MiG and Vallejo paints and Vallejo pigments for weathering. He will eventually add the crew from Pasquel Miniatures.

Carlos Delgado brought two models to show. One was an A- Skyhawk in 1/72nd scale built from the Hasegawa kit, the other was a MiG 31 built from the Revell kit also in 1/72^d scale.

Justin Segovia brought several models to show. Justin had a Junkers Ju 188 that was captured intact in France and repainted in French Naval markings and used by the French after WWII.

He brought the Italian Battleship Roma in 1/700 scale. This ship was sunk by a Fritz X guided missile dropped from an He 111, the first ship to be sunk in this manner. He also had an Me 109E but I lost the photograph in the transfer from e mail to the photo section of my computer. He had several other models on the table.

Arthur Berdick brought a number of models to the meeting. He had three 54mm figures that were metal but did not give a company of manufacture. On the left in the photo is an officer of Light Infantry of the Kur-Hessian Legion circa, 1809. In the middle of the photograph is an NCO of the "Landgraf-Karl" a Hessian-Kassel Regiment circa, 1814. On the right was Jaeger of the Russo- German Legion 1814.

Arthur had four other items to photograph. One was a 1/72nd scale German Dampflokomotive type BR86 Duetches Rocks Bahn by Hobby Boss circa WWII. In 1/35th scale Arthur had a World War II British Long Range Patrol Jeep built from the Tamiya kit; a U.S. Marine Cougar 4 x 4 MRAP built from the Panda kit and a Land Rover WMK with a Milan ATGM built from the Hobby Boss kit.


