Gerhard Gotzmann had an Airfix 1/48th scale FRS. 1 Sea Harrier marked in Falklands Conflict colors circa 1982. He mixed black and white acrylics for the primer and ended up leaving it as the final color.

Michael Kennedy had an Italeri Me 262 in 1/48th scale. He used the kit decals which all silvered, however his Hakencruz decals were after market and did not silver. The white "22" numbers were painted on the model. He added detail in the cock pit with seat belts and shoulder harness, which were scratch built.

Carlos Delgado had a Su-27 from Zenghdefu to show. This was in 1/48th scale, in a great looking digital camo.

Roy Lingle brought the Tamiya/Fine Molds model of the Japanese Army type 5 Chi-Ri medium tank in 1/35th scale. This is a "Limited Edition" release and was new in the box.

Edward Rogers brought a Scratch Built "Crawler" designed by his son. He made this machine from balsa, plastic card, and some metal parts. Some of the detail came from HO scale railroad parts. Interesting. It would seem his son has an idea how future machines should look.

Fabian Nevarez had an Italeri OH-58D in 1/48th scale in the scheme worn during operations in Iraq. As work in progress he had an Academy MD 500 Defender helicopter, also in 1/48th.

Jose C. Diaz had another of his paper buses to show. Jose had an ADO Dina Avante Coach scratch built in 1/32nd scale.

Steve Hennessee had a neat Fujimi Garage Diorama in 1/24th scale to display. Neat model and well done. He also had a 4 assorted WWI Bi-Planes all in 1/72nd scale built from the Academy release of the old ESCI kits and some from re-release of the Revell kits.





Steve Herren brought a variety of models to show. He had a Saab Viggen, a 1950 Chevrolet pick up with a midget racer and trailer in tow, a 1050 Chrysler, a Cobra and a Fiat. His last model was a Deep Space Nine model. I did not get any info as to scales or kits used from Steve.

As mentioned earlier in the GLUE, **Julio Sanchez** brought as WIP's, a Mirage F-1 in 1/32nd scale. He also had an AJ-1 Savage in 1/48th scale. These models are scratch built efforts by Julio.

Wayne Williamson brought an old Tamiya 1/35th scale Merkava. It was only 3./4 finished, but still a good kit according ot Wayne. Wayne also had a Tamiya 1/35 Abrams TUSK. Wayne use some classic Tamiya parts from

the 1982 release of the original M-1 issue, some parts from the 1992 M1A1 Abrams and some parts from the 2004 release of M1-A and the parts from the 2012 TUSK set. All of these parts together make a decent model and





was a whole lot easier that combining the DML Kit with the aftermarket items needed to build the same variant. His second offering was a 1/350th scale Trumpeter "Liberty Ship" Quote Wayne: "an awful kit but he built it for his dad because Wayne's grand father was a member of the Merchant Marine in WWII.

Joseph Roper brought his 1/72nd scale Revell U boat U-565, a type VII-C submarine. This U-Boat was sunk 24, Sept, 1944.





