
The El Paso Scale Model Society

Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.

We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). Schedule changes are published ahead of time in the newsletter.

Jim Davis brought the second section of VF-3, Felix the Cat that was based on the USS Saratoga, CV-3 circa 1931/32, built from the Monogram Boeing F4B-4 kit in 1/72nd scale.

Marco Antonio Landero from Juarez, Mexico brought some very nice items to show. He had a diorama of a PzKw IV that has been captured by Russian troops complete with a girl on a bicycle, and a wrecked horse drawn cart and he called it "El Brindis, 1943" (A Toast, 1943). Another diorama was a single figure fishing in a stream with a wooden bridge, authentic looking water and stream background behind the fisherman. His third model was a 1 to 9 scale Bust of a Native American woman painted from the Pegasus model. All extremely nice work from the Doctor.

Mike Kennedy had three T-38 kits to show and compare as to detail, length, and stuff like that. He plans to build all three as comparison builds using the Sword kit as a T-38 of the USAF Thunderbirds, the Wolpack boxing in the white training scheme markings and the Trumpeter in the Holloman AFB black scheme that was used for the F-117 chase planes when training new pilots for



the F-117. Mike also had an F4F as a work in progress. This was the Tamiya 1/48th kit being modified to an FM-1.

Kai Garcia had some models that he was designing on his NoteBook. Interesting.

Roger Gutierrez brought an 86 Ford Thunderbird Motorcraft (NASCAR) as a

WIP. He also had a 1991 Ford thunderbird Motorcraft (NASCAR) in progress.

Jose Roldan brought a 1/144th scale F-18E "Bravo" from the movie "Planes." Jose has shown a great deal of interest in the new "Godzilla" movie, commenting on the trailer that is available.






Native American Woman




